

Summer Seminar at Furman University July 20-23, 2022

Purpose: Through *interactive lectures and intensive small group sessions*, the purpose of this course is to provide in-depth instruction in the McClosky TechniqueTM which *empowers individuals to release tension and access breath* for healthy voicing in both speaking and singing.

Target Audience: Speech-Language Pathologists, Singing Voice Instructors, Singers, Choral Conductors, Classroom teachers

By the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- Apply and demonstrate the McClosky approach to posture, breathing, and relaxation of key muscle groups in singing and speech

- 4) Troubleshoot posture and breathing challenges
- 5) List the characteristics and strategies for managing vocal development from birth through senior adulthood
- 6) Discuss appropriate vocal hygiene for the voice
- 7) Compare speech production to song production in the voice
- 8) Describe a healthy approach to contemporary singing styles
- 9) List common vocal disorders
- 10) Create a plan for maintaining personal healthy voice use in the workplace and beyond
