CEU vs. Graduate Credit

Most participants who choose to receive Continuing Education Units or Graduate Credit, do so because their employer requires some form of Professional Development. The option you choose should depend on what is required by your employer. Please note that all participants receive a certificate of completion, stating that the course consists of 20 hours of instruction.

Some participants choose Graduate Credit in hopes of having the credits count toward a future graduate degree. Each institution has different requirements for accepting transferred graduate credit. Neither The McClosky Institute of Voice nor Northwestern State University can guarantee what another institution of higher learner may or may not accept toward a future degree.

CEUs

Receive <u>2 units of Continuing Education</u> through Northwestern State University of La^{*}. A certificate will be mailed to all participants who complete the required CEU request form and pay an administrative fee of \$5.00. The certificate will list the program, the number of Units (2) and the number of contact hours completed (20). Participants must attend all sessions of the seminar to receive the full 20 contact hours of credit or 2 Units.

Graduate Credit

Participants who complete all the requirements may receive <u>1 hour of graduate credit</u> from Northwestern State University of LA*. There is an additional cost for Graduate Credit paid directly to Northwestern State University. This cost has been greatly reduced for McClosky participants.
